HOW TO USE THIS BOOK

God made every star in the sky. God gives every beat to our hearts. And this God hears us as we talk to him.

That's *amazing!*

When we pray, God promises to listen to us. When we pray, God promises to give us what we need. And the Bible shows us that God always keeps his promises.

When you have a conversation with someone, you listen to them and you speak to them. It's just the same with God. Prayer is us speaking to God, and the Bible is God speaking to us. So it's great to pray in response to what we hear in the Bible.

In this book, you'll find 92 prayers that are each linked to a summary of and a verse from a Bible story. These prayers will take you all the way from beginning to end of the true story of the Bible – from Genesis to Revelation. And at the end of this book, you'll find nine prayers that are perfect for praying at bedtime.

Right at the back is an index, helping you quickly turn to prayers that are particularly helpful in moments or feelings that most of us – children and grown-ups – experience as we go through life.

Each prayer links with a Bible story in the God's Big Promises Bible Storybook. So you can use these prayers after you've read the story from the Bible Storybook, or you can use them at a different time of the day. Or you can use this book on its own.

One more thing: every prayer in this book contains one or more of these types of prayers:

- **Praise** prayers, where we praise God for how great he is. We can call these 'Wow!' prayers.
- **Thank you** prayers, where we thank God for what he's done or will do for us.
- **Sorry** prayers, where we say sorry to God for the things we've done that are wrong.
- Please prayers, where we ask God for his help.

Each of these types of prayers – Wow, Thank you, Sorry, and Please – are marked in a **different type of writing**. And each comes with its own action to do with your body, if you'd like to:



That will help everyone join in with the prayer as it's read aloud.

Being able to pray to God really is amazing. God promises that if we are followers of Jesus, he'll listen to us in the same way that a great dad listens to his children. And, as the Bible story tells us over and over again, God always keeps all of his promises!

Prayers based on The Old Testament

In the Beginning

In the beginning, God made everything. The best thing God made was a man and a woman to be friends with him and take care of the world. It was all very good.



The Bible says, "God created human beings in his image … He created them male and female. God blessed them."

(Genesis chapter 1 verses 27-28)

Dear God,

We know that you are in charge of this world. You always know what is best for us, because you made us.

Thank you that you put so many good things in this world for us to enjoy. **Thank you** that you give us good rules that help us enjoy everything.

Please keep reminding us that your ways are always best. Amen.

The Snake and the Tree

Adam and Eve listened to the snake instead of to God. They decided to disobey God, and ate from the tree God had told them not to eat from. But they did not feel as happy as they had before.



"The woman ... took some of its fruit and ate it. She also gave some of the fruit to her husband who was with her, and he ate it."

(Genesis 3:6)

Dear God,

It is sad that the first people chose to disobey you instead of loving and obeying you.

Sometimes we are tempted to do the same thing. Sometimes we think that disobeying you will be good. But it never is.

So, we are **sorry** for the times when we don't obey you. **Thank you** that you always love us, even when we disobey you. Amen.

Out of the Garden

Because Adam and Eve had sinned by not loving and obeying God, they could not enjoy life with God forever. But God promised that one day someone would put everything right again.



"The payment for sin is death. But God gives us the free gift of life forever in Christ Jesus our Lord."

(Romans 6:23)

Dear God,

The world has gone wrong because people sin. I am **sorry** for the ways that I sin by not loving and obeying you.

Thank you that you can forgive me and help me do the right thing next time.

Thank you for promising us that one day Jesus will put everything right again!

Thank you that you always keep your promises. Amen.

People worked together to disobey God. They built a tower to show how great they were. God stopped them building, so that they would spread out and fill the world, just as he had planned.



"The Lord scattered them from there over all the earth. And they stopped building the city. That is where the Lord confused the language of the whole world."

(Genesis 11:8-9)

Dear God,

You have a good plan to make sure that there are people all over the world who love and obey you.

Thank you that your good plans always happen and that no one can stop them.

Thank you for people who have gone to live in other countries so that they can spread the news about you there. **Please** give them bravery and energy. Today, right now, **please** cause more people in more countries to become your friends. Amen.

God's Promises to Abram

God promised Abram a huge family and a good land to live in. They would live under God's rule and be happy. God promised to use Abram's family to bring that happiness to people all over the world. Abram believed God.



"Then the Lord said to Abram, 'Leave your country, your relatives and your father's family. Go to the land I will show you. I will make you a great nation, and I will bless you ...

And all the people on earth will be blessed through you.'"

(Genesis 12:1-3)

Dear God,

You make big promises, and you keep your big promises. **Thank you** that you have promised us that you will always love us, that you are with us, and that all your people will enjoy life with you forever.
