



hristmas. For many of us, the word conjures up happy memories. Good times—simpler times.

Things seem more complicated now. Life is harder, less certain, and more fearful. Pandemic, politics, protests... We can still put up the Christmas lights and light the candles, but the world does seem darker than it used to be.

In difficult times, we look for hope—something to hold on to, something to look forward to, something or someone that can say to us, "It will get better". But where to find it? 1. HE CAME FROM THE FATHER

The first Christmas says that there is such a God—a God of relationship: Father, Son and Spirit. "The one and only Son" came

from heaven to earth to show us that he is there, and that he is in control. But... if God is in control, what is he doing?

2. HE IS FULL OF GRACE

What is God like? "Full of grace"—that is, full of overwhelming kindness. Because he's full of kindness, God is moving things towards the day when he will remake this world perfectly. No more uncertainty, fear, pain or death—only joy and peace. Because he's full of kindness, Jesus was born to do everything necessary to invite us into that future world. Because he's full of kindness, Jesus offers the forgiveness we all need for the ways we've all lived as if this is a world in which we, not God, are in charge.

Christmas tells you that one day things will be better than they have ever been; and that God is inviting you to enjoy it with him.

3. HE IS FULL OF TRUTH

It's hard to find your way in the dark. And sometimes life feels as if we have taken a sudden turn off a well-lit road and on to some dark, unfamiliar country lanes. Enter Jesus, "full of truth". He knows the way we need to take and the decisions we need to make. He offers us guidance and confidence in life.

So, here's the Bible's claim: Christmas brings hope. If the Bible's true, Jesus brings us the hope we're all looking for. But *is* it true? Why not find out more for yourself—you have nothing to lose, and a lot of hope to gain.
