


These pictures are different scenes from today's Bible verses. Colour and cut out the pictures. Glue the pictures on another sheet of paper in the correct order.


Practise telling the story using the pictures, then share the story with your friends and family.


Peter – I think from all I have seen that he must be the Christ that God has been promising. Joshua – I think he might be Elijah. We have been waiting for him for so long.
