Drama script

Narrator: One morning, King Nebuchadnezzar ordered his workers to build an enormous gold statue. His builders began to build. It grew big...

Nebuchadnezzar: Build it bigger!

Narrator: It grew bigger...

Narrator: It grew enormous...

Nebuchadnezzar: Build it bigger! Now stop! I really like the look of that statue.

Narrator: When the statue was built, everyone in the country came to see it. Daniel's friends, Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, were there.

Nebuchadnezzar: I am King Nebuchadnezzar! I am the greatest king of all! When the music sounds, I command everyone to bow down and worship my statue!

Narrator: Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego had a big problem! They could never bow down and worship a statue. They only worshipped God. How do you think they felt?

Children shout: Under pressure!

Nebuchadnezzar: Sound the music!

Nebuchadnezzar: Everyone bow down and worship! Now!

TRUMPET: Trumpet is played again.

Narrator: Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego had to decide what they would do. How are they feeling?

Children shout: Under pressure!

Nebuchadnezzar: Bow down now! I mean everyone!

TRUMPET: Trumpet sounds again.

Did you hear me? I mean everyone!

Narrator: Nebuchadnezzar could see three men standing up, while all the other people were bowing down to the statue. Who do you think it was? How do you think they were feeling?

Children shout: Under pressure!

Nebuchadnezzar: Maybe I didn't make myself clear. When the music sounds, everyone bows down and worships my statue. And anyone who doesn't—will be thrown into the furnace. Now let's try that again!

TRUMPET: Trumpet blows.

Narrator: Still Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego would not bow down and worship. How do you think they are feeling?

Children shout: Under pressure!

Nebuchadnezzar: That's it! Heat up that furnace!

FURNACE: Ask the children to throw in some of their cellophane 'flames'.

Nebuchadnezzar: Heat it up more!

FURNACE: Ask the children throw in some more of their cellophane 'flames'.

Nebuchadnezzar: Heat it up more!

FURNACE: Ask the children to throw in the rest of their cellophane 'flames'.

Nebuchadnezzar: Now throw those men into the furnace!

Narrator: How do you think Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego are feeling?

Children shout: Under pressure!

Narrator: Here's what happened next.



Read **Daniel 3 v 16–18.**

Narrator: Nebuchadnezzar was furious.

Nebuchadnezzar: Throw them in!

Narrator: They were thrown in. But then something surprising happened!

Nebuchadnezzar: Hey! Why aren't those men burning? They're just walking around in there; they are not harmed in any way. And there's someone like an angel with them. What's going on? Hey! Come out of there—now!

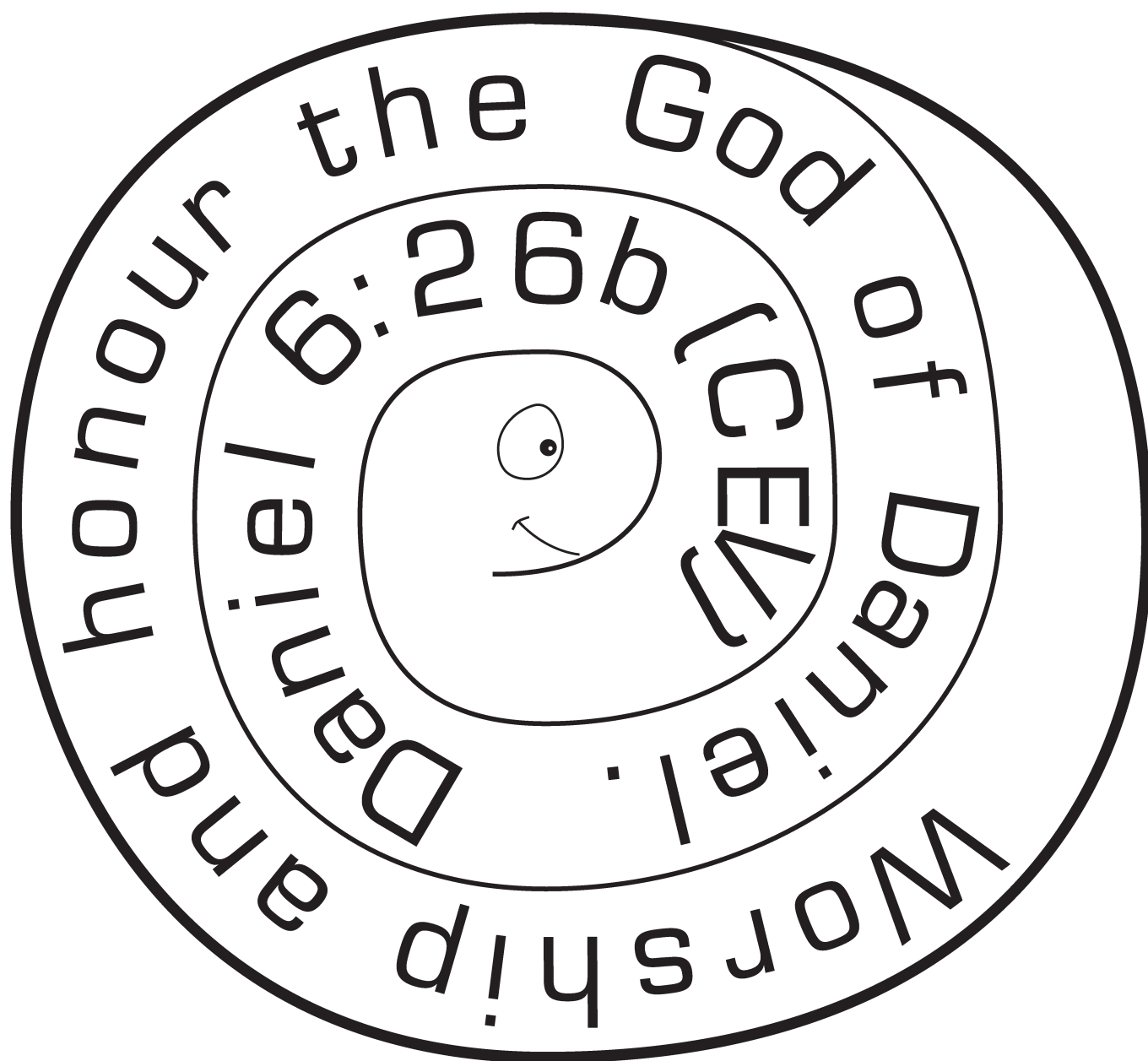
Narrator: God had protected Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego. He rescued them from the fire. Now Nebuchadnezzar knew that the God of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego is the true God, the only one who should be worshipped. How do you think Nebuchadnezzar was feeling now?

Drama script

Officials: Your Majesty, we hope you live forever! We all agree that you should make a law forbidding anyone to pray to any god or human except you for the next 30 days. Everyone who disobeys this law must be thrown into a pit of lions.

King Darius: Hmm... I guess that sounds like a good idea. Maybe I should think....

Officials: Don't waste time thinking O great king. Just sign here!

Narrator: So King Darius made the law and had it written down.

Officials: Now, let's get Daniel! Every afternoon he prays to that God of his—right in front of the open window. Once we see him—he's had it!

Narrator: Daniel heard about the law, but when he returned home, he went upstairs and prayed in front of the window. Just as he had always done, he knelt down in prayer, giving thanks to God.

Officials: There he is! He's praying. Let's tell the king and have him arrested! It's the lion pit for him! (Pause) Your Majesty, remember the law says that everyone who prays to anyone but you will be thrown into a pit of lions?

King Darius: Yes, I do remember something like that...

Officials: That Jew named Daniel refuses to obey you. He still prays to his god three times a day. You know he'll have to be thrown to the lions.

King Darius: What!? Did I miss something here? But Daniel's my best worker! He's like a friend to me! Oh no—what can I do about this?

Narrator: For the rest of the day, the king tried to think how he could save Daniel. There was nothing he could do. So King Darius ordered Daniel to be thrown into a pit of lions. But first he spoke to Daniel.

King Darius: You have been faithful to your God, and I pray that He will rescue you.

Narrator: A stone was rolled over the pit, and it was sealed. All night long the king could not sleep. He did not eat anything, and he would not let anyone come in to talk to him. At daybreak the king got up and ran to the pit. He shouted...

King Darius: Daniel, you were faithful and served your God. Was He able to save you from the lions?

Narrator: The king held his breath and waited. (Pause) He heard a voice.

Daniel: Your Majesty, my God sent an angel to keep the lions from eating me. I am safe!

Narrator: The king was relieved to hear Daniel's voice, and he gave orders for him to be taken out of the pit. God had kept him from being harmed. The king commanded that everyone should worship and honour the God of Daniel.

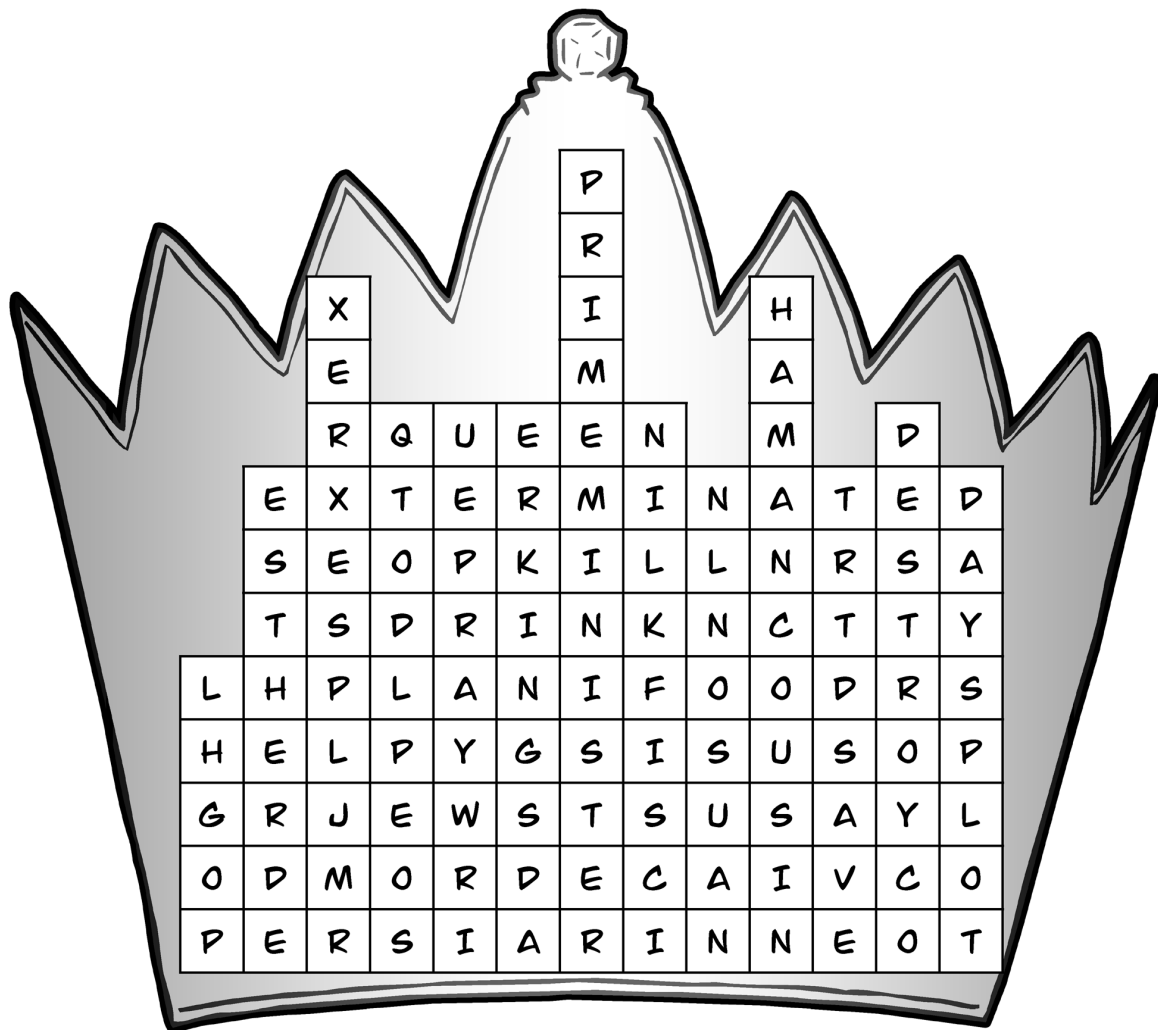

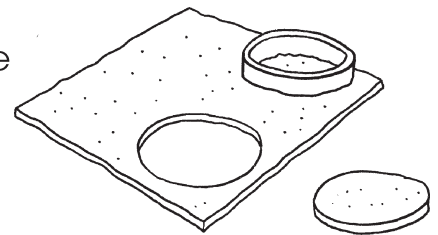
Purim pastries- Hamantashen

The story of Esther and the Jews is still remembered by Jewish people today. They have a celebration called Purim. This food called Hamantashen is part of the celebration. Hamantashen means 'Haman's pockets'. It is made into a triangle shape, because it is thought that Haman wore a three-cornered hat.



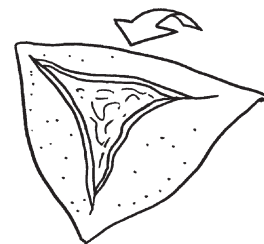
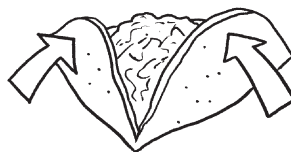
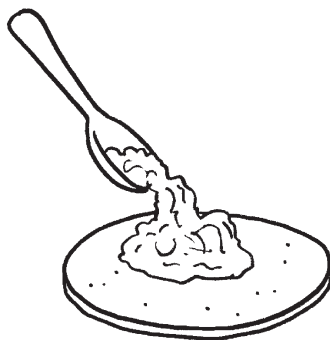
Gear

- Pastry – frozen short crust is easiest
- Filling: 1½ cups chopped prunes
grated rind and juice of one lemon
½ cup chopped walnuts
½ cup crushed cornflakes
- Biscuit cutter, teaspoons, knife, honey to glaze
- Baking tray



Instructions

1. Roll out the pastry, cut into circles with a round biscuit cutter.
2. Mix all the filling ingredients together.
3. Place a teaspoon of the mix onto a pastry circle.
4. Fold twice to make a quarter-circle, or triangular shape.
Pinch edges together to seal. Glaze with honey.
5. Place on a baking tray and cook for 12-15 minutes in a moderate oven.
6. Cool on wire racks.
7. Eat!

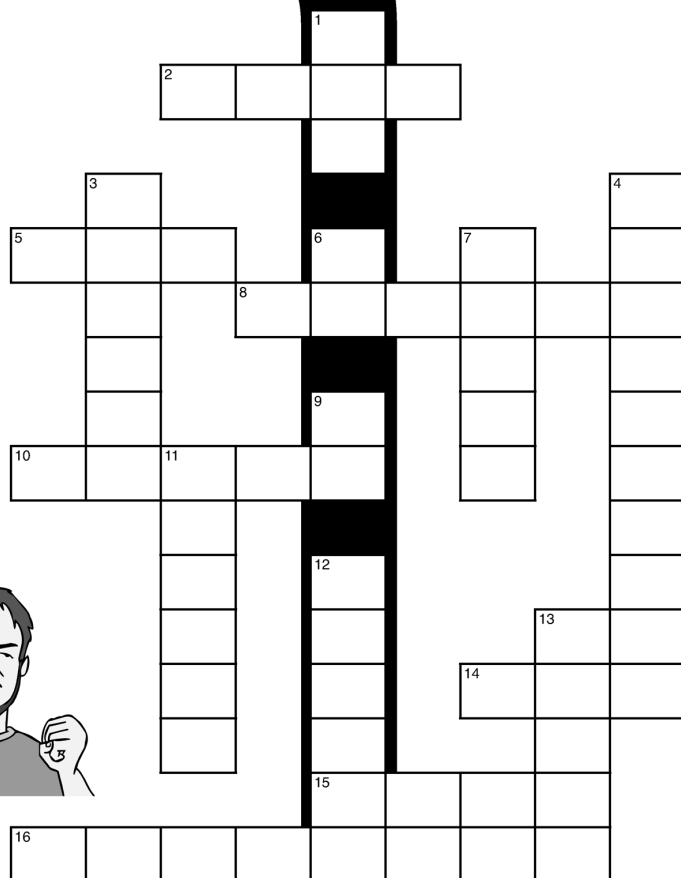

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Helen Roseveare in the Congo

On August 7, 1964, Congo rebels captured Stanleyville (now known as Kisangani). In the four years since Congo's independence from Belgium, most white people had already fled from the nation or been captured or killed. Because Helen Roseveare was a doctor, she had been spared, although not without many serious incidents. For example, someone had tried to poison her, but her dog ate the meal intended for her and died.

Helen was well aware of her danger. Many mission women had been attacked by the marauding rebel armies. She stayed on, believing that 'If Christ be God and died for me, then no sacrifice can be too great for me to make for Him'. That was the mission motto. She knew that an earlier generation of missionaries to Africa had died of malaria and other jungle diseases for the sake of God and His glory. God might well demand a different kind of sacrifice of her as He already had of other women missionaries.

Part of that sacrifice was the struggle with pride as Africans took over and sometimes mismanaged mission affairs. She struggled to sleep some nights when terror overtook her. Peace was even harder to attain after her house was looted of every item of worth. She continued to learn to see

God in the details of her life, to trust Him more fully.

On Saturday, August 15, 1964, a truck load of soldiers took over the hospital compound at Nobobongo. They would occupy it for five months. 'They were brutal and coarse, rough and domineering. Their language was threatening and obscene. All of us were cowed. We did exactly what they demanded, mostly without argument.' Tension was terrific.

'We heard that the local chief had been caught, bound and beaten; then he was taken to the people's tribunal at Wamba, found guilty, flayed alive and eaten. No wonder we did not sleep well. No wonder we were not hungry.'

Then Helen and others were taken. '... We were put off at a house in the jungle – 19 defenceless women and children surrounded by some 75 men, soldiers and others, all filled with hatred and evil intentions toward us ... And in my heart was an amazing peace, a realization that I was being highly privileged to be identified with [Christ] in a new way, in the way of Calvary.'

Although attacked and humiliated by the rebels, Helen found that God gave her an even deeper love for the Congo people. In 1965 she returned to pick up her medical mission work.
