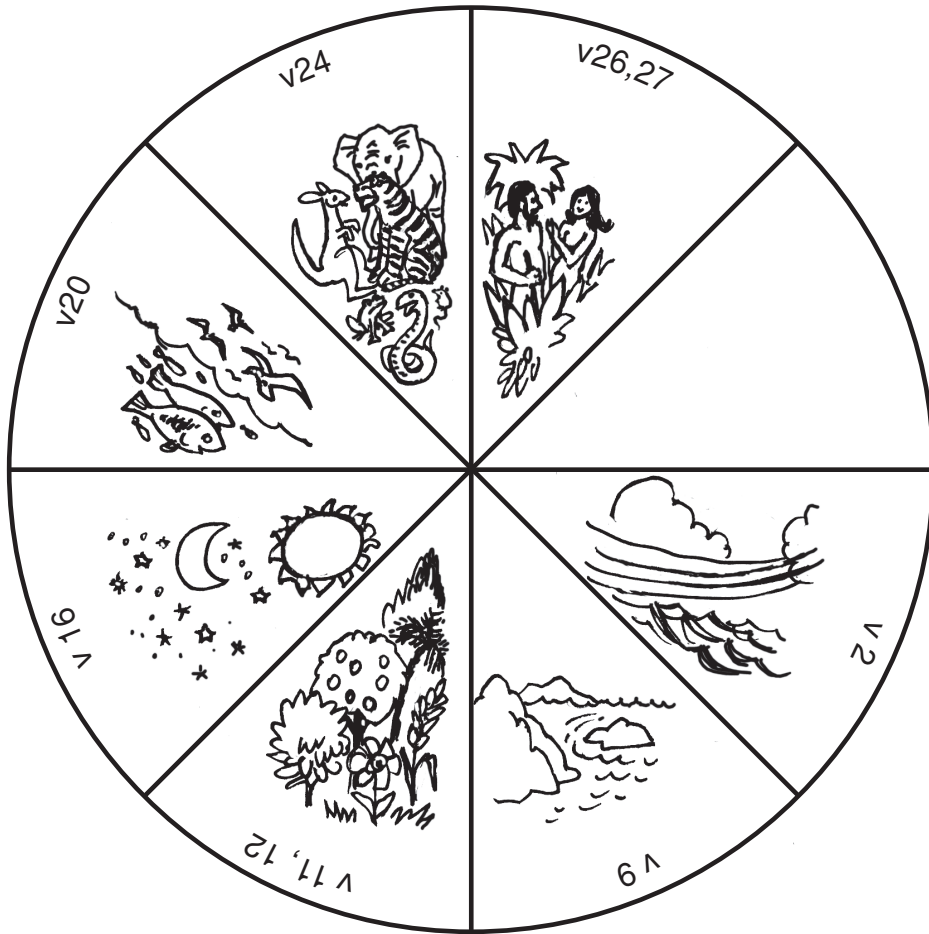

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# GENESIS 11 v 1-9 (CEV)

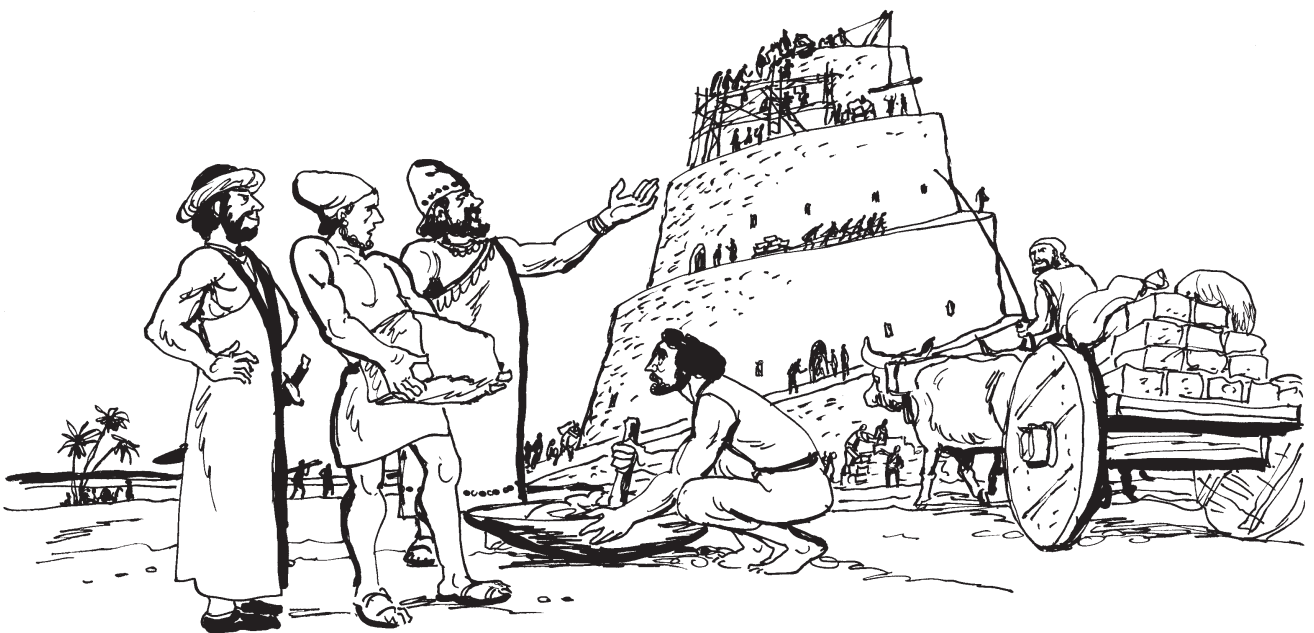
**A**t first everyone spoke the same language, but after some of them moved from the east and settled in Babylonia, they said:

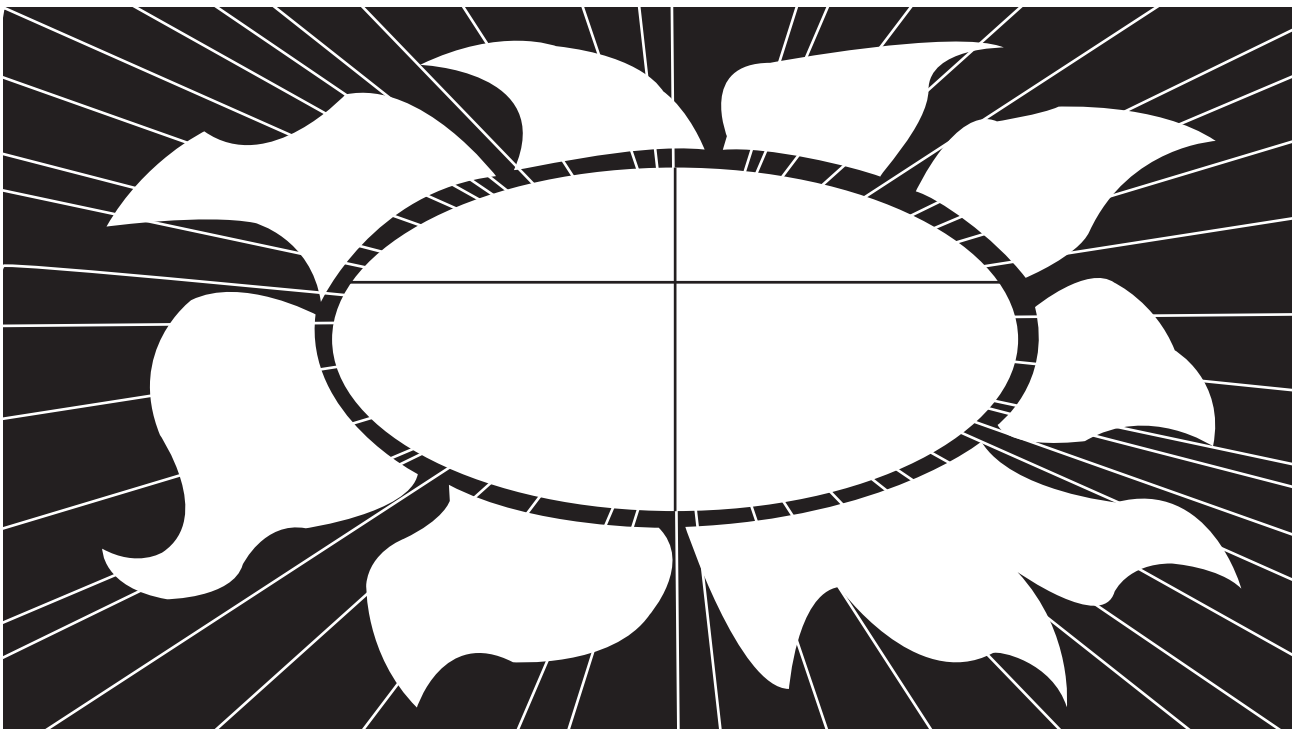

## Drama—Interview with Isaiah

- Isaiah:** (Walks in with a walking stick. Hobbles to chair.) Good morning everyone. Aah—it is so good to sit down at last. That time-travelling donkey was very uncomfortable.
- Interviewer:** Did you say a ‘time-travelling donkey’?
- Isaiah:** Yes, silly little thing hadn’t been ridden for ages. Lucky I got here safe and sound!
- Interviewer:** Yes—lucky you did! Um, who did you say...
- Isaiah:** By the way, where am I exactly? (Looks around.) Funny building this. What kind of a place is it?
- Interviewer:** Well, you’re at (insert name of town) and this is our hall. We meet here every Sunday. We learn from God’s Word.
- Isaiah:** Well, *that’s* a good idea! By the way, my name is Isaiah—the prophet Isaiah. Pleased to meet you. I wouldn’t mind a little bit of goat stew and a drop of wine—is there any around here?
- Interviewer:** Aah, no. I’m terribly sorry. We’re all out of goat stew today. And the red wine, well, um...
- Isaiah:** A pity. Never mind. What did you want to ask me about?
- Interviewer:** Well, now that you’re here, we were going to read from your book this morning—chapter 53 as a matter of fact.
- Isaiah:** Chapter 53, eh. Just remind me how that goes. It’s been a while since I wrote it.
- Interviewer:** Verses 4–6 go like this.
- Reader:** ‘He suffered and endured great pain for us,  
but we thought his suffering  
was punishment from God.  
He was wounded and crushed because of our sins;  
by taking our punishment,  
he made us completely well.  
All of us were like sheep that had wandered off.  
We had each gone our own way,  
but the Lord gave him  
the punishment we deserved.’
- Isaiah:** Oh, yes. I remember that bit. It just blew my mind the first time I heard it.
- Interviewer:** But what does it mean?
- Isaiah:** It’s about a special servant who was to come. This servant would finally do something about the biggest problem God’s people ever had.
- Interviewer:** Was that the Philistines? Or maybe Queen Jezebel? Or King Ahaz?
- Isaiah:** No. This problem was much worse than they ever were!
- Interviewer:** What was their biggest problem?
- Isaiah:** Their biggest problem was sin. Most of the kings were terrible and just didn’t obey God. Most of the people were the same. The people of God just kept sinning against Him.
- Interviewer:** What sort of things did they do?
- Isaiah:** I don’t even want to tell you how bad it was! They broke God’s laws. They worshipped idols. They lied and cheated each other. They let the poor suffer. They wouldn’t listen to God’s messengers. It was terrible!

**Interviewer:** So, how could God fix this problem?

**Isaiah:** Aah—that’s the amazing part. Read on.

**Reader:** ‘The Lord decided his servant would suffer as a sacrifice to take away the sin and guilt of others.’

**Isaiah:** Yes! That’s the part I was thinking of. This servant would take the punishment that the people deserved. Read the next bit.

**Reader:** ‘Although he is innocent, he will take the punishment for the sins of others, so that many of them will no longer be guilty.’

**Interviewer:** So one person, even though he didn’t deserve it, would suffer and die for the sin of others? And then the guilty ones would no longer be guilty?

**Isaiah:** Yes. You’ve got it. Doesn’t seem fair, does it?

**Interviewer:** Not really.

**Isaiah:** Well, it might not be fair on the innocent servant, but it’s very good for the rest of us! Uh oh!

**Interviewer:** What’s wrong?

**Sound FX:** (‘Ee aw’ donkey sounds off-stage.)

**Isaiah:** I can hear that time-travelling donkey again! I think I have to leave. You know, I really feel like some goat stew! If you ever visit me, I’ll serve you a big bowl of goat stew.

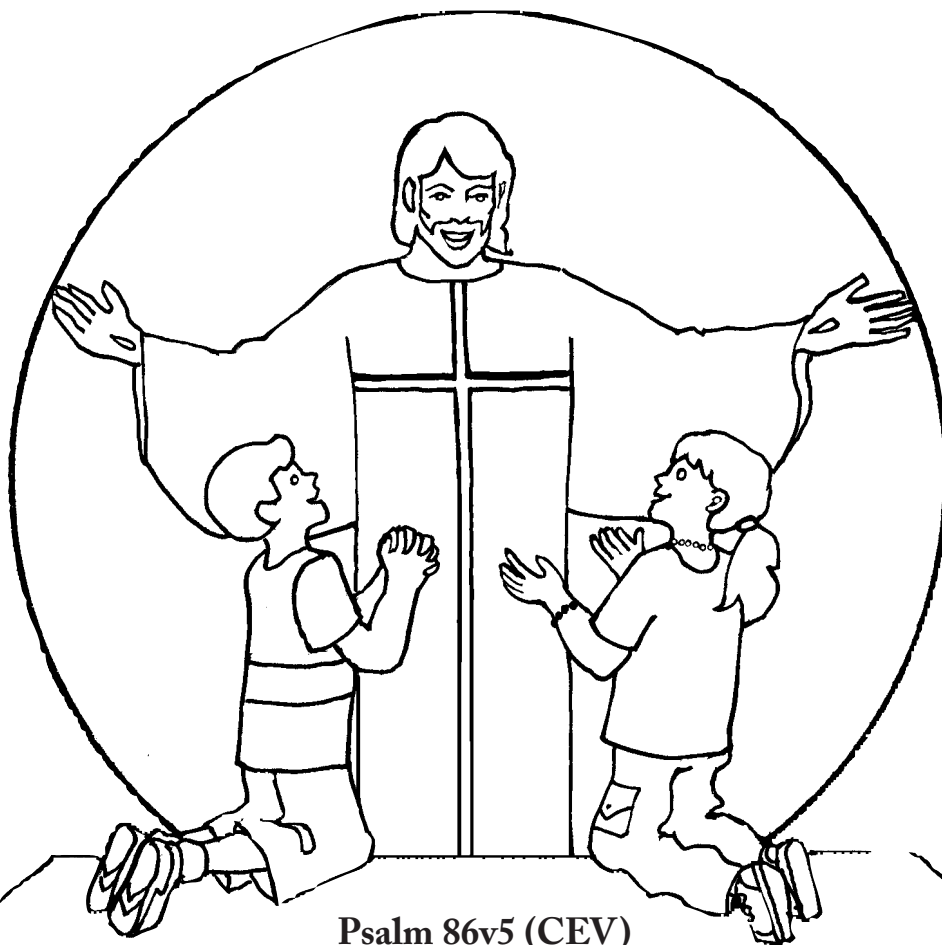
**Interviewer:** Thanks for the invitation. Maybe we’ll all drop in some time. Bye Isaiah.

**Isaiah:** Bye. (Voice trails off as he leaves.)

## Drama—Interview with Matthew

- Sound FX:** ('Ee aw' donkey sounds off-stage.)
- Matthew:** (Walks in, rubbing his back and stretching.) That stupid donkey! We landed in the middle of the Antarctic by mistake. I'd love a hot drink of goat's milk—I realise you probably haven't got wine as there is a shortage in these parts. And some lentils on flat bread with a touch of spice.
- Interviewer:** Well, I suppose we could make a pot of tea...
- Matthew:** Pot of what? I think I'll pass, thanks. Maybe water?
- Helper:** (Child brings a glass of water.)
- Matthew:** What's this stuff? See-through pottery! How amazing! By the way, Matthew's the name. I'm an ex-tax collector and a bit of a writer. I wrote a biography once—a famous person He was too!
- Interviewer:** He's still famous! You wrote about Jesus, didn't you?
- Matthew:** Yes, I did. I knew Him myself. He was a close friend of mine—a really good bloke.
- Interviewer:** We were just about to read some of your book. Maybe you could help us?
- Matthew:** Go right ahead. Read it and ask anything you want.
- Reader:** 'The chief priests, the leaders, and the teachers of the Law of Moses also made fun of Jesus. They said, "He saved others, but he can't save himself. If he is the king of Israel, he should come down from the cross! Then we will believe him."
- Matthew:** (Puts head down onto one hand. Looks sad and closes eyes.)
- Reader:** "'He trusted God, so let God save him, if he wants to. He even said he was God's Son.'" The two criminals also said cruel things to Jesus.'
- Matthew:** I remember that day. I was so afraid. I was so confused. How could Jesus let them do such terrible things to Him? How could all of our dreams end like this—with His death on a cross? He had never done a thing wrong! He didn't deserve it!
- Interviewer:** Let's hear the next part.
- Reader:** 'At midday the sky turned dark and stayed that way until three o'clock. Then about that time Jesus shouted, "My God, my God, why have you deserted me?"
- 'Some of the people standing there heard Jesus and said, "He's calling for Elijah." One of them at once ran and grabbed a sponge. He soaked it in wine, then put it on a stick and held it up to Jesus.
- 'Others said, "Wait! Let's see if Elijah will come and save him." Once again Jesus shouted, and then he died.'
- Matthew:** It was such a terrible thing, Jesus dying. But later we understood why He had done it. He did it to fulfil God's promise.
- Interviewer:** I think that's the promise we read about before—from Isaiah's book.
- Matthew:** Yes. That's the one. The promise was that a servant would come and die for the sins of others. That's just what Jesus did on the cross that day. He kept God's promise. (Matthew sits up and brightens.) It was worth it, you know!
- Interviewer:** What do you mean?
- Matthew:** Because of Jesus' death, we can be forgiven for our sin. He took our punishment. Uh oh! There's that donkey.
- Sound FX:** ('Ee aw' donkey sounds off-stage.)
- Interviewer:** You know I'd really like to see that time-travelling donkey! Maybe we could take a ride one day?
- Matthew:** I don't think you'd enjoy it as much as you think you would. Bye for now.

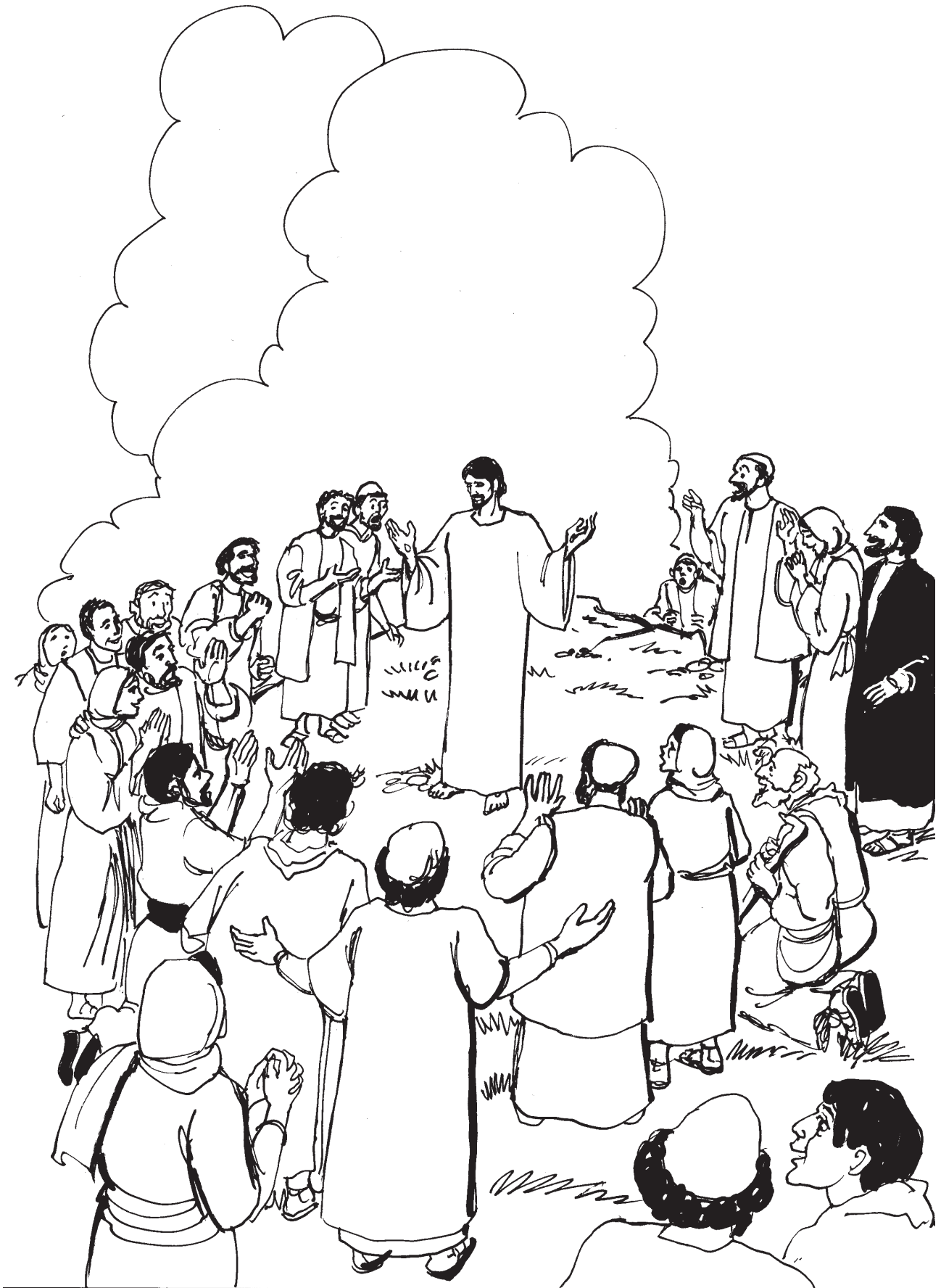

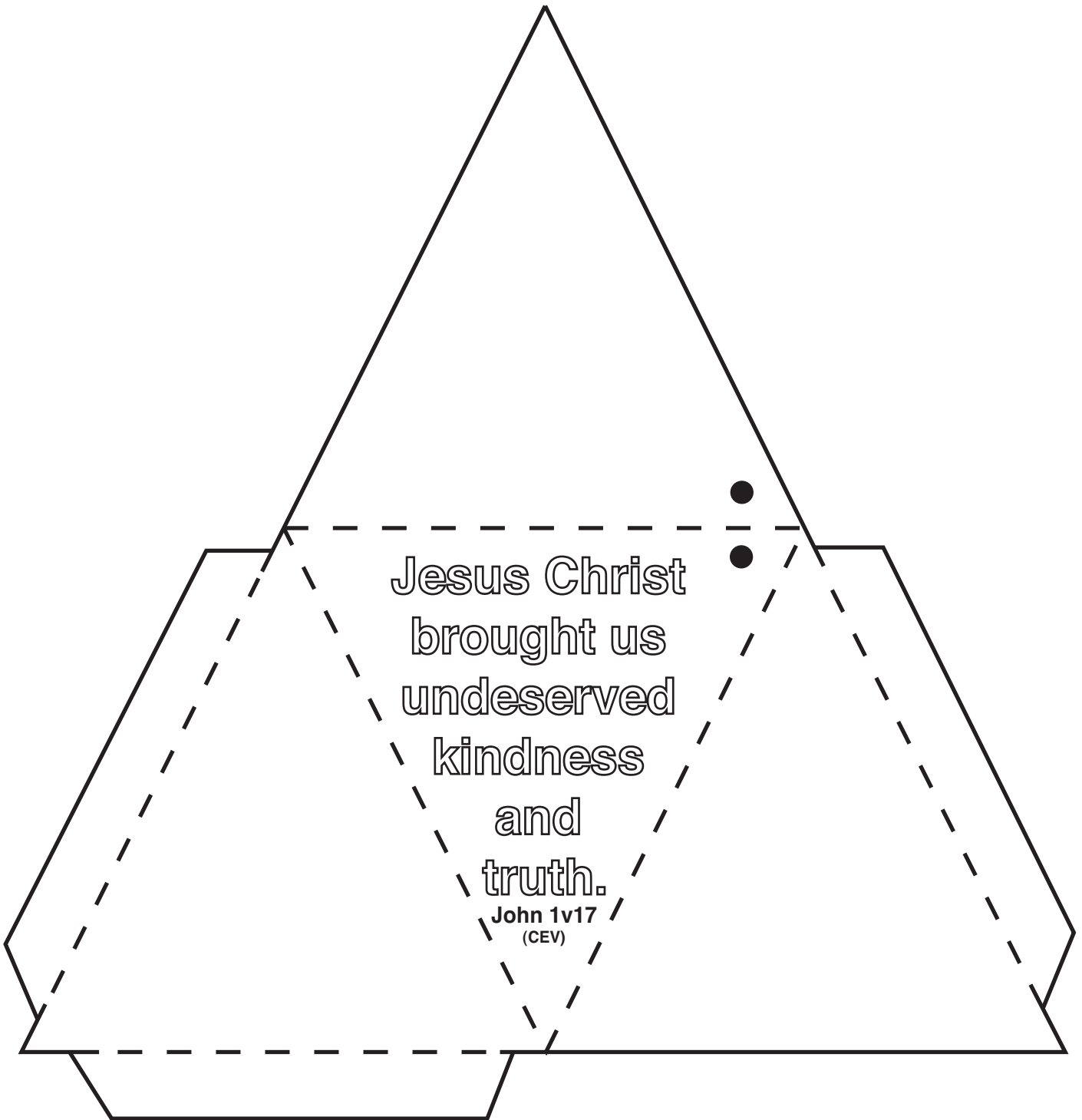

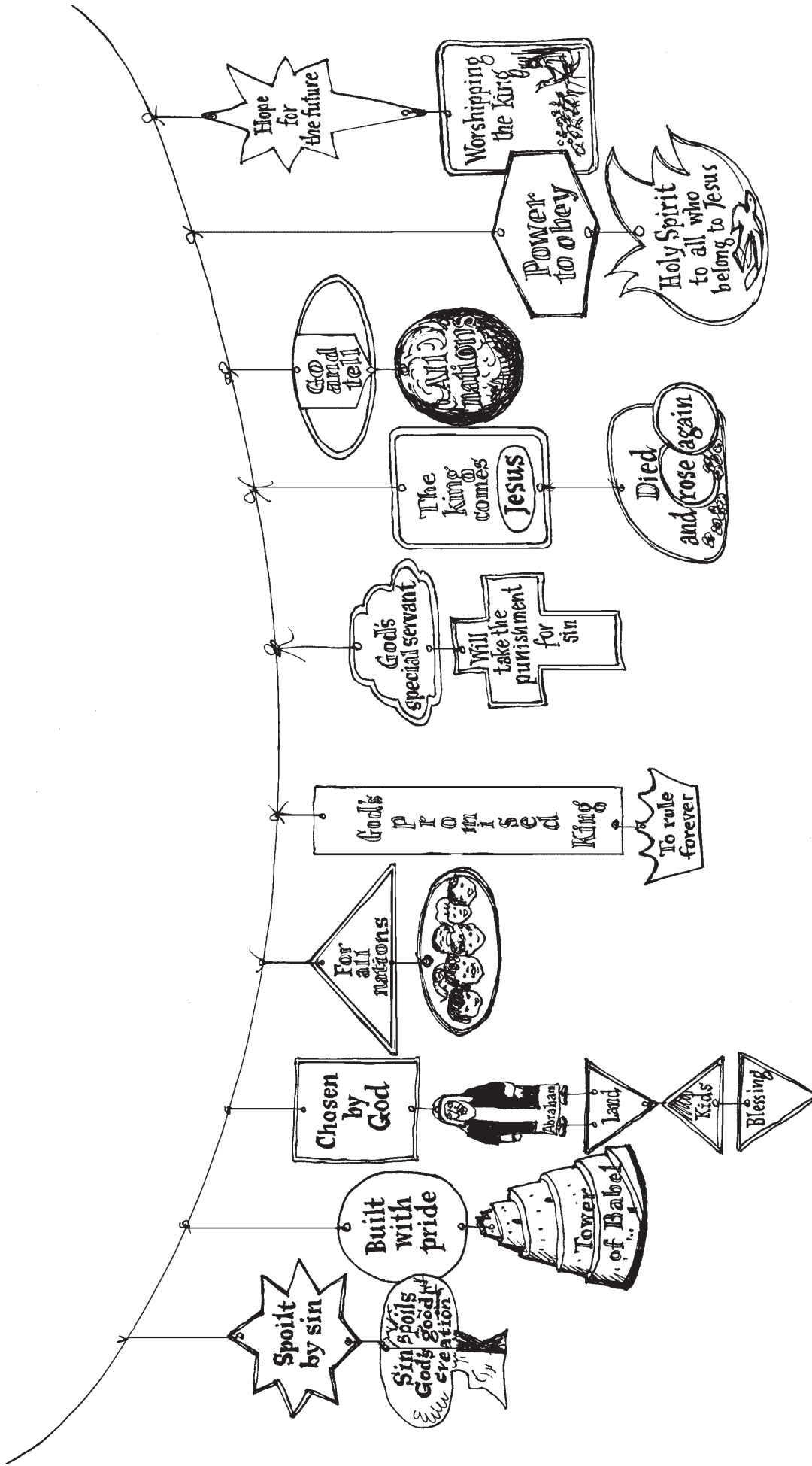
