

# Thunder and a Vow

July 1505

CRACK! A BOLT OF LIGHTNING strikes the earth. Its flash knocks Martin Luther on his back. His bag and belongings fly across the rain-soaked road. Boom! Thunder crashes again.

This will be my death, Martin thought.

It was Sunday, July 2, 1505. A day that would

change his life. The week before, the twenty-oneyear-old law student had been visiting his parents in Mansfeld, Germany. But as Martin traveled back to the university, he was caught in a deadly storm. The University of Erfurt was only six miles ahead, but Martin wasn't thinking about school.

If Martin had graduated, he'd have been an amazing lawyer. He was smart and good with words, but he wasn't thinking about the money he'd make in a successful law career. He couldn't argue his way out of the storm. There was only one way out. Martin knew his parents wouldn't like it, but in his panic, he bargained with God. What if I pledge my whole life to serve the church? Will you spare my life if I become a monk?

Martin knew what becoming a monk would mean. Years before, while at boarding school in Magdeburg, he'd watched what happened when Prince William of Anhalt decided to become a monk. The prince had left his palace, entered the monastery, and taken a vow of poverty. He had been reduced to begging on the streets. "With my own eyes I saw him," Martin

later wrote. "I saw him carrying the sack like a donkey. He had so worn himself down by fasting . . . that he looked like death, mere bone and skin."

Why would Martin want to live such a hard life? What could tempt the young man to defy his parents, give away the expensive legal textbook his father had bought him, and forsake a promising career as a lawyer to become a beggar? It wasn't just his fear of lightning and thunder. Other fears raged in Martin Luther's soul.

Martin's father, Hans, was a miner and demanded much of his son. His mother, Margarethe, terrified Martin with the fear of God. She had told him about devils that gather in the dark forest at night. She had warned him about witches that cast spells on cows to dry up their milk. On top of the fears Martin had learned in his family, everyone around Martin thought about death and God's coming judgment all the time. In the 1300s, Europe had faced a massive outbreak of the bubonic plague, the "black death." Nearly a third of the continent's population died.

## - Artistic Judgment -

Two woodcut prints, popular at Martin's time, give us a window into the people's fears. One, called the *Dance of Death*, features skeletons summoning people from all walks of life (pope, emperor, prince, child, and laborer) to the grave. Another portrays Christ the Judge sitting on his throne above a rainbow. Lilies extend from his head to the faithful on his right, and a sword extends to the wicked at his left. The message of these images is clear: *Be prepared. Death and judgment can come at any moment.*

Without modern medical advances, people didn't count on living long.

All alone on the road, the warning flashed in Martin's heart like the lightning around him. Psalm 29 says, "The God of glory thunders, . . . The voice of the LORD flashes forth flames of fire" (29:3, 7). Afraid that God the Judge had come for him in the storm, Martin called to the patron saint of faithful miners like his father. Fearing devils might spring from the wood and drag him to hell by his curly hair, Martin cried out, "Saint Anne, help me! I will become a monk."

With those words, Martin committed himself to the only life he believed would guarantee him peace and assurance of final salvation. But what if it didn't? What if becoming a monk couldn't calm the storm in Martin's soul?
