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How to use Discover

Here at Discover, we want you at home to get the most out of reading the Bible. It's how God speaks to us today. And He's got loads of top things to say.

We use the New International Version (NIV) of the Bible. You'll find that the NIV and New King James Version are best for doing the puzzles in Discover.



The Bible has 66 different books in it. So if the notes say...

Read Mark 6 v 1-3

...turn to the contents page of your Bible and look down the list of books to see what page Mark begins on. Turn to that page.

"Mark 6 v 1" means you need to go to chapter 6 of Mark, and then find verse 1 of chapter 6 (the verse numbers are the tiny ones). Then jump in and read it!

Mark: Who is Jesus?

We join Mark in the middle of his action-packed account of the life of Jesus. We see Jesus do and teach lots of amazing things that leave His friends, His enemies and even His own family baffled: just who *is* Jesus?!

Mark shows us that Jesus is the Messiah — the King God promised would rescue His people. It's great news! But Jesus also calls people to follow Him as their King. And that's definitely going to ruffle a few feathers...

Genesis: God's promises

We jump into Genesis to meet Abram: an ordinary old man, who God makes extraordinary promises to!

Abram has no kids — but God promises to give him loads of descendants. Abram is living in a tent — but God promises to give his descendants a whole land of their own. Abram is nobody special — but God promises to bless the whole world through his family!

Watch as God follows through on His amazing promises, even when Abram tries to take matters into his own hands and messes up big time! See how God always keeps His promises, and is so loving and forgiving to those who trust Him.

Elisha: God's prophet

We turn to the book of 2 Kings to read about Elisha. He was a prophet, sent by God with a message for His people and their disobedient king! And to prove that Elisha really was His messenger, God did loads of astonishing miracles through him.

So brace yourself for bullying boys and man-eating bears, poison stew, floating axes and invisible fiery chariots. It all shows us God's great power, His love for His people, and how important it is for people to turn back and live His way.

Philippians: Joy for Jesus

The apostle Paul is writing a letter to his friends in Philippi... from prison. Does Paul's jail sentence get him down? No way! Because Paul is just so joyful about what God has done for him and for the Philippian Christians. He can't stop praising God!

Paul writes to the Philippian Christians to thank them for a gift they sent to him in prison. But he has loads more fantastic stuff to say about Jesus, and how to live for Him. He wants Christians to serve Jesus together as one united team!

There's nothing better than to spend some time alone with Jesus, talking with Him. Do you set aside time each day to spend with Jesus? Why not set yourself a specific time?



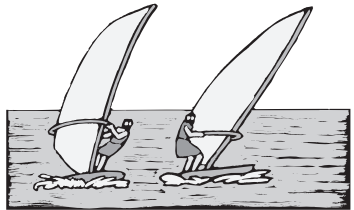

It's not what goes into someone that's the problem.

It's what comes out. Wrong thoughts, words or actions.
